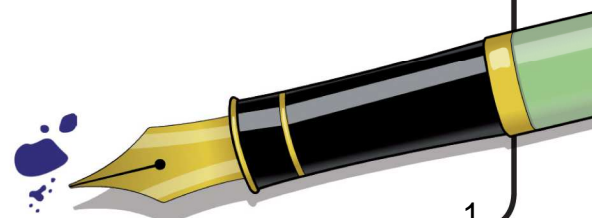

How much have you learned about essay writing? Read each of the following statements and decide whether you should or shouldn't do it in a formal essay.

	Do	Don't
Make a plan before you start to write your essay.		
Write the essay without thinking about the question.		
Use planning methods such as spider diagrams, bullet points and charts to plan your essay.		
Give your essay a lengthy introduction.		
Explain your opinion with evidence to justify your thoughts in the conclusion.		
Include relevant quotations.		
If you are in an exam, write a draft essay before your main essay.		
Use slang or colloquial expressions.		
Use the personal pronoun, e.g. "I think..."		
Use contractions in your writing.		
Use the passive voice when appropriate.
